Water (1 gallon of water per person per day for at least **Dust mask** (to help filter contaminated air) 3 days, for drinking and sanitation) Plastic sheeting and duct tape (to shelter-in-place) Food (at least a 3-day supply of non-perishable food) Moist towelettes, garbage bags, and plastic ties Battery-powered or hand-crank radio and NOAA (for personal sanitation) Weather Radio (with tone alert and extra batteries for both) Wrench or pliers (to turn off utilities) Flashlight and extra batteries Can opener for food (if kit contains canned food) First aid kit Local maps Prescription medications (at least a 7-day supply) Cell phone (with chargers, inverter or solar charger) Glasses Extra cash (ATMs might be inoperable) Whistle (to signal for help) Extra fuel (for generator and car) Multi-purpose tool (like a Swiss Army knife) ADDITIONAL ITEMS TO CONSIDER ADDING TO A BASIC EMERGENCY SUPPLY KIT: Infant formula and diapers Household chlorine bleach and medicine dropper (When diluted 9 parts water to 1 part bleach, bleach can be Pet food, leashes, crates, and medications used as a disinfectant. Or in an emergency, you can use it to treat water by using 16 drops of regular household liquid Important family documents (such as copies of insurance bleach per gallon of water. Do not use scented, color safe or policies, identification, emergency contact information, and bleaches with added cleaners.) bank account records in a waterproof, portable container) Fire extinguisher Emergency reference material (such as a first aid book) Matches (in a waterproof container) Sleeping bag or warm blanket (for each person) Feminine supplies and personal hygiene items Complete change of clothing (including a long-sleeved shirt, long pants, and sturdy shoes) Paper and pencil Compact and portable dinnerware (camping mess kit or Books, games, puzzles, or other activities for children disposable plates, cups, utensils, and paper towels)
